Proposal for collective amendments to UN Regulations Nos. 151, 159, 160 and 167.

The text reproduced below was prepared by the expert from The Netherlands on behalf of the IWVTA IWG to delete the Unique Identifier (UI) marking provisions. The modifications to the existing text are marked in bold for new and strikethrough for deleted characters.

in accordance with the requirements of UN Regulation No. 167 as amended by the 01 series of amendments.



The above Unique Identifier shows that the type concerned has been approved and that the relevant information on that type approval can be accessed on the UN secure internet database by using 270650 as Unique Identifier. Any leading zeroes in the Unique Identifier may be omitted in the approval marking."

VIII. Justification

WP.29, during its 195th session in March 2025, adopted the proposal prepared by the informal working group on the International Whole Vehicle Type Approval, ECE/TRANS/WP.29/2025/17. That proposal puts the implementation of the Unique Identifier (UI) marking on hold by amending Schedule 5 of the 1958 Agreement to read:

"... the approval markings required by UN Regulations may be replaced by a Unique Identifier (UI) preceded by the symbol UI, if unless explicitly specified otherwise in the UN Regulations and subject to the availability of the corresponding feature in the secure internet database."

This means that the UI marking cannot be applied anymore 'by default'.

- 2. The possibility for the alternative UI marking was however already addressed in a number of UN Regulations (Nos 148, 149, 150, 151, 159, 160 and 167).
- 3. This proposal supplements Regulation No. 151 by deleting the 'by default application' of the UI marking.
- 4. As the UI concept was not yet implemented into the UNECE secure internet database 'DETA', UI markings could also not have been applied yet. A Supplement is therefore considered appropriate.
