It is based on document ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRVA/2025/10. It is submitted to the World Forum for Harmonization of Vehicle Regulations (WP.29) and to the Administrative Committee (AC.1) for consideration at their June 2025 sessions.

* In accordance with the programme of work of the Inland Transport Committee for 2025 as outlined in proposed programme budget for 2025 (A/79/6 (Sect. 20), table 20.6), the World Forum will develop, harmonize and update UN Regulations in order to enhance the performance of vehicles. The present document is submitted in conformity with that mandate.



Paragraph 5.4.1.1., amend to read:

“5.4.1.1. The AEBS function shall be automatically reinstated at each initiation of the powertrain⁴. A new engine start (or run cycle) which is performed automatically, e.g. the operation of a stop/start system, shall not be considered an “initiation of the powertrain” wherever that term is used in this Regulation.”

Insert new footnote 4, to read:

“⁴ As defined in Mutual Resolution No. 2 (M.R.2) of the 1958 and the 1998 Agreements containing vehicle propulsion system definitions, document ECE/TRANS/WP.29/1121.”
